### **Understanding How Options Are Priced**

For example, a Delta of 0.40 means that the option's price will theoretically move \$0.40 for every \$1 move in the price of the underlying stock or index. Call options. Have a positive Delta that can range from 0.0 to 1.00. At-the-money options usually have a Delta near 0.50.
